From our 1986-1987 Secretary KE8KH Patti- Patti wrote a summary of our club and read it at the annual meeting. Everyone liked it so well, it was decided to put it, in the newsletter. OUR CLUB IS GROWING!!!!

The club was first rejuvenated on May 5, 1987 at a meeting attended by 15 area Hams. Since then, we have had an average meeting attendance of 27 members, with our roster boasting 55. The club has sponsored 2 Novice class sessions which, along with some individual guidance have yielded a dozen new hams. There has been at least nine license up-grades within the club as well. We now have a treasury balance of \$1563.61 which has been an average income of \$130.71 per

month, with all expenses paid. The by-laws have been written, revised and effectively at work. We have three capable trustees to assist the officers in decision-making. We have a dedicated volunteer editor putting out a monthly ZERO BEAT newsletter to help us all to stay on the same frequency. We have committees for: Activities and Programs, Club euipment, Rosters, Correspondance, Repeater, Field Day, as well as an active ARES group participating in a weekly practice net. In ARES we have assisted the Red Cross with a triathalon, worked with mile leaders for Hands Across America, and handled communications for four mock disasters with area officials. Our ticket sales were a success in netting the treasury about \$1000.00. Socially we had a picnic in Silver Park, a Christmas Awards Banquet, and a Charter Party. Our Mall Display and demonstration was a fun and exciting success. We gained great interest from potential hams and tremendous PR for the area by exposing our hobby. We are now both incorporated, and ARRL affiliated. The doors are open in Alliance and it's surrounding communities for us as Amateurs to uphold the principles of Amateur Radio which are:

- 1. Serve the public as a communications service.
- 2. Advance the radio art.
- 3. Improve the Amateur Radio Service.
- 4. Expand the pool of trained operators.
- 5. Enhance International Goodwill.

We have to keep it that way


