The KESKH Public Service Repeater System is the result of countless hours of manpower, the accumulation of community PR and a dedication to the project. Many Hams gave freely of their time, their knowledge and their equipment. We are working closely with public officials and have been partially funded by a grant from the Salem Community Foundation.

The system was devised as a link in the chain ensuring the continuity of communications in order "1) to provide emergency or public service communications when normal communications are disrupted." The Alliance AND Salem areas will benefit from the security of enhanced facilities to serve between

Alliance's 537- N3DZA Repeater and the Columbiana County repeaters.

The equipment within the repeater system is up to date in accordance with our efforts 2) to advance the state of the art."

Our hopes are for widespread use of the 146.865- Repeater. Together, in one small way we are attempting "3) to improve individual skills in radio operation."

The installation, experimentation, programming and the assembling of remote bases are ways of working "4) to provide a reserve pool of qualified radio operators and technicians."

In my mind, the end goal, beginning in and extending from our own neighborhood is "5) to promote international goodwill."

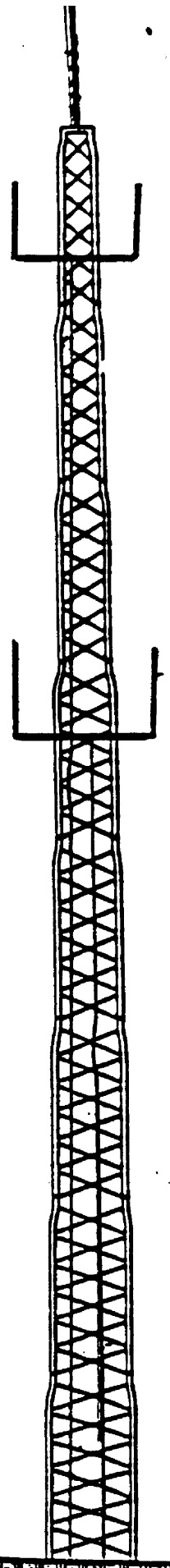
My thanks to all who have been on the team and to all who support these five objectives of the Amateur Radio Service.
