Duties of Officers

STERBA ON GAIN

Well, the silly season is upon us. One of the hammy mags just put out its annual antenna buyer's guide. I have no interest in embarrassing them so I'll not mention them by name (they probably just don't know any better), but they ran an ad that is complete quackery. Would you believe...a vertical groundplane with four radials having 5.25 dB gain on horizontal and 4.75 dB gain on vertical?

How about this claim? "Multiplication factors/horizontal 17 times, vertical 15 times." Would I be the grumpy old Kurt that people accuse me of being if I asked, "Multiplying what?" Let's see now, a 10-times multiplication of power would be a 10 dB gain, so it can't be that. What

a puzzlement! The same company has a 4-element, and I do quote, "Power multiplication 65X."

I know that some may be getting a little green around the gills from reading this. Please don't go away. It gets even better (in a negative sense). The claimed gain (for a half-wave boom-length) is 16.5 dB; front to back ratio is "48dB true."

Wait! Wait! There's more! Verbatim: "Audio Gain: 22 dB." What in the name of Zeus is "audio gain" when looking at antennas?

And 22dB? Hey we're getting up to VOA numbers now. (I wonder if the people at the magazine held their noses when they put that ad in the book.)

Just think of all the waste that has gone on all these years. Think about those massive arrays put up by Radio Canada International...All they really had to do was stack a couple of half-wave boom-length antennas from Route 1, Ethelsville, Alabama.

Antenna expert Joseph Carr K4IPV, wrote in his *Practical Antenna Handbook*, "Unfortunately antenna gain is an area where unscrupulous salespeople can distribute a little salt water taffy."

Actually the Antenna Buyer's Guide is terribly flawed. Pages and pages of data about every antenna made and the graph says "Gain (dB)." I ask, just what kind of dBs are those, bub -- dBi or dBd?

Of all the numbers I looked at, it seemed that DX Engineering claims are closest to what I believe in the 20M Yagi department — 6.1 dB gain and judged superior at Dayton. Yet the gain is 4dB less than the other guy. Looks to me like a good reason to buy one.

Meeting adjourned 8:22 p.m.




Remind your friends that our class has begun

The Alliance Amateur Radio Club Mall Show was organized by the club but had displays from various clubs in the area.

They included: The Salem Area Amateur Radio Association, the Canton Amateur Radio Club, the Alliance Youth Radio Club and the Military Affilliate Radio System.

PREPARATION

The antenna raising party was held on Aug. 29 with John WX8G, Dan N8LVO and Steve KB8NDM acting as the roof crew and Jim N8MAA on the ground lending support. Jim also bought the round of coffee after the work..

The roof crew installed 1,350 feet of RG-8 (that's a quarter mile), 16 barrel connectors, 3 HF verticals, 3 J-Poles and 2 mag-mount antennas.

FRIDAY NIGHT

Twelve people showed up at 9 p.m.for the setup. The mall provided us
with free tables and chairs, and set
them up for us. We hung the signs and
ran the coax from the skylight pan
above the gazebo to the tables where
they would be used the following day.
The group from the Salem Club
brought in their communications
trailer, the table assignments were
confirmed and plans were finalized for
the next day's operations.

SATURDAY

We showed up bright and early at 8 a.m. to set up the stations and organize the handout table. We also did some last-minute antenna work on the roof.

After all was set up, we had surprisingly few problems. At the CARC packet station run by Chris KB8LPJ, we learned a lot about the attenuating properties of RG-8 feedline.

About three months before the mall show, we had made arrangements for Mark Koontz to come and talk on severe weather and Amateur Radio.

At the last minute, Mark cancelled 3 hours before he was to speak..

Thinking quickly, Jim N8MAA got on the phone and invited Don Whitaker K8OMO to speak in Mark's place. Don has been very active in ARES and SKYWARN for many years and his experience showed. He was very well received by the crowd. Disaster had been averted as Don saved the day!

On Saturday, 72 hams checked in with 55 from outside the club. We had hams operating packet, Amtor, SSB, CW and FM. Those club members not working a station helped out by explaining ham radio to the public. It worked out very well, indeed.

On Sunday, we opened at 11:30 a.m. and ran until 5 p.m. We had 40 hams check in with 28 being from outside our club.

We started packing up at 4:30 p.m. and in 2 hours, we had all the tables stowed, equipment packed in the cars and antennas and feedline off the roof.

The Best of Show Award went to Jim KB8GHZ, who will display his work at the next meeting. Thanks to all and expecially the folks at the Carnation Mall.


