ARES volunteers rack up 100+ man-hours ferrying nurses to Timken Mercy Hospital

Blizzard doesn't halt amateurs

Amateurs usually know how to deal with threatening weather like thunder-storms and tornadoes. But what happens when there is a blizzard? Roads are closed. Traffic and lines of communications grind to a halt. The safest thing to do is just to sit tight unless you have a 4-wheel drive or other all terrain vehicle.

That is why the work of one Amateur Radio Emergency Service group shines out as an amazing example of just what can be done under extreme conditions. "Their amateur community had an emergency net standing by, giving directions for drivers to pick up personnel going to TM."

In all, Stark County ARES provided about 2 dozen rides for nurses to Timken Mercy. They operated from 10 p.m., Saturday, March 13 to 5 p.m. Sunday which amounts to more than 100 man-hours of all-volunteer service. Four of the 13 Amateur Radio operators pulled 10-hour shifts through the night.

The Stark County ARES in Canton, Ohio was able to ferry nurses to Timken Mercy Hospital during the height of the storm that dumped heavy snow and high winds on the area.

"They were doing a good job," said Donovan Whitaker K8OMO, emergency communications radio officer for Disaster Services Agency, Alliance.



Thurs., April 1 7:30 p.m. First Church of God This is about the third time that the Stark County ARES has provided the ridership program, said Dave Beltz WD8AYE, emergency coordinator for Stark County ARES. Dave said the last time the group responded in this manner was the winter storm of April, 1987.

"The roads were good. Some of them got a little tricky, but we stuck within a certain area and only picked up the ones that were absolutely necessary.

"The nurses that were there Sunday thanked us for the help. A couple said they couldn't believe we were doing it for free," Beltz recalled of this "routine" job.

He said because of the good communications between the amateurs and the hospital, they are always informed when such a need arises.

EXPANDED 220?

In response to a request by the ARRL, the FCC has proposed to establish a secondary allocation for the amateur service in the 219-220 MHz band to be used for amateur auxiliary station (point-to-point) packet backbone networks and other amateur point-to-point fixed communications.

The Commission also proposed operating limits and other measures to ensure that such amateur operations do not cause interference to primary operations in and adjacent to the 219-220 MHz band.

MINERVA REPEATER

Carroll County has a second repeater on the air as of March 15. The 443.200 (PL 131.8) repeater is owned by Randy Everett WA8SMQ of Malvern. The antenna sits atop a 75-foot tower and runs 200 watts. And at 1200 feet, the repeater should provide good coverage for the county. While no autopatch is planned for

quite a while, Everett said a DVR and voice mail gets first priority in the near future. The other repeater is K8VPJ's 442.625 repeater.
