February 6, 2002

The regular meeting of the Alliance Amateur Radio Club was held at the Alliance Community Hospital on February 6, 2002, at 7:30 P. M., with Robert Steele K8RLS, president, presiding. Secretary David Glass W8UKQ kept the minutes. There were 17 members and three guests present. The pledge of allegiance was given, and introductions were made.

Visitors, Alan Savage KC8SFS, Matt Kraner KC8RYG, and Joe Young were recognized.

The minutes of the last meeting were published in the newsletter. There were no additions or corrections.

Mary Ann KB8IVS reported the treasury balances. The report was approved upon motion by David N8NLZ, seconded by Gladys KB8GIA.

Old business: John KD8MQ moved that the Christmas party be held December 14 at Mike's Roadhouse. The motion was seconded by Dave W8UKQ, and approved.

There is no information about the 70 cm. repeater becoming available.

There will be a joint meeting of Stark County area clubs on

March 27 at Stark State College.

There has not been a reply from the Salvation Army for the donation to SATURN.

A Saturday breakfast meeting will be held at Taster's Choice on the second Saturday. (NOTE: This was canceled later because we could use the room for only one hour.)

It was noted that the ARES net mentions AARC and our nets.

New business: A thank you was extended to Jack W8WEN for the name and call badges which he has donated to our members.

John KD8MQ reported that he will be able to produce Zero Beat only bimonthly. He will look into finding a supplier for shirts, jackets, caps for club members.

Don K8OMO moved that donations of \$25 be made in the spring and in the fall to QRZ. net. The motion was seconded by Frank WA8WHP, and approved.

Dave W8UKQ called attention to the report in the ARRL letter about RFIDs being allowed in the 70 cm. band. Bob K8RLS discussed hamfest procedures with the Tusco members. John KD8MQ moved, seconded by Jerry K8CAT, that we invite them to our meeting at their convenience to give us their advice. Motion approved.
