- cation accessible to the public, but his signal must be receivable at the starting location.
- 9. The winner will be the person with the lowest score, which will be computed by multiplying time in minutes by miles. The Fox will write down the times and odometer readings of those who find him. Someone will be selected to gather the information at the starting point.
- 10. The Fox will choose a frequency on the 2 meter band and convey that information to someone who will be at the starting location. It will be kept secret until the Fox Hunt begins.
- 11. The Fox should transmit for at least 30 seconds at a time and at least once every 3 minutes or so. Longer and more often is OK.

If you haven't been to a Fox hunt before, or if you need ideas, check out KD8MQ's web page at www.qsl.net/kd8mq/rdf/rdf.html. John also has links to other pages on Radio Direction Finding. Come to the meeting and ask questions. You might want to go with someone else on your first hunt. There was some information printed in the Feb. '03 Newsletter which might be helpful.

Keep safety in mind. If you pull over to take a bearing, do so in a safe location. Obey speed limits and other traffic laws. Hope to see you at the Fox Hunt. You can't help but have fun. □
