The regular meeting of the Alliance Amateur Radio Club was held on December 2nd, at 7:30 PM at Alliance Community Hospital. President John Myers, KD8MQ presided. The pledge of allegiance was recited, followed by introductions.

There were 15 members, and 3 guests present.

We then paused for a program by Robert Gilbert, KA8JOY, on the subject of Crash scene investigation.

Afterwards, we took a break for the consumption of donuts, before continuing with the business meeting.

Minutes were accepted as printed in the Zero Beat, on a motion by k3gp, seconded by K8DXR

The Treasurers report was presented by Mary Ann, KB8IVS, and accepted on a motion by K8DXR, and seconded by WA8WHP.

Committee reports

Field Day report- President John reported that the results have been posted on the ARRL website.

Our final score was 3646 Pts. We made 939 QSO's. We outscored the Massillon club, but the Canton club beat the pants off everyone, with 8956 pts. (2283 QSO's)

George, K3GP gave a

recap of the recently held Field Day Committee meeting.

Some of the points covered were:

- No change in location this year.
- We need to do more setup on Friday night
- We need to add digital modes to our arsenal
- A volunteer is needed to do satellite QSO's
- We should do NTS messages ahead of time, and dump them into the during the Field Day Period.
- Copy the W1AW bulletin the night before.
- Enlist more elected officials to show up
- We need a GOTA station, and someone to act as coach. looking for volunteers
- Need more CW ops
- Scheduling of operators should be seriously considered
- We should stay at class3A, but we need:
- ⇒ Smarter band changes
- ⇒ Someone to work the night shift on 80 Meters.
- New Field Day software is being considered
- Outboard CW sending units are also being considered.

K8OMO points out that we need more people to come back to the club.

The question was then raised as to how many members we had in the club. Mary Ann responded that we had close to 30 members at this time.

We are still waiting for the 2010 Field Day rules to be posted sometime in Early February

How's your CW?

(This is a reprint from the July, 09 Zero Beat. This is the program that I'll be demoing at the January meeting.—KD8MQ)

After returning home from Dayton, I heard that I had missed seeing a new piece of software which sounds invaluable to anyone whishing to increase their CW speed. The program is c a I I e d R u f z X P (http://www.rufzxp.net/), and is a free download.

The designers of RufzXP describe this software as

"an excellent training software for improving code speed and CW practice, particularly (ultra) high speed memory copying of true amateur radio calls. Focusing

on improvement of CW proficiency, it is no contest simulator and does not provide for QRM. It provides additional tools for keeping track of training progress and comparing with other operators via International RufzXP Toplist".

So far, I have installed this on three computers (XP Pro, ΧP Home, Win2000). I won't say that the install was a "piece of cake", but it should cause no trouble for most of us. The most important pre-requisite is to have ALL your updates done before attempting to install RufzXP. Specifically, You need MS .net 2.0/3.0, and direct 9.0C installed. Once all that was done, the installs were a snap.


RufzXP sends a chosen number of random selected true amateur radio calls (50 by default) to be typed into the keyboard. After <ENT> key has been pressed, the computer gives its next call.

If the call has been copied correctly, the transmitting speed increases, if not, it decreases. In this way software automatically adapts transmitting speed to user's maximum performance. Every last call can be heard once again by pressing F6-key (50% penalty).

The number of points for each call is primarily related to the CW-speed sent, the number of errors and the length of the call. In addition typing time exerts a minor influence. But it is helpful to think about whether the heard call is useful or not.

The initial speed is variable, from 8 to 803 (not a typo) WPM. As you run the program, you will notice that the pitch changes from one callsign to another.

My CW speed was never great to begin with, but with the help of this program, I hope to make a stab at 40 CW at this years Field Day. (KD8MQ)



C.To enhance utilization of the 2 meter band and simplex operation.

Objective:

Stations in Stark County — To work as many stations as possible

Stations outside Stark County - To work as many Stark County stations, in as many cities, townships, or villages, as possible.

Entry Classifications:

Low Power: Station running a Power level of 5W or less

High Power: Fixed station running a Power level of more than 5W Mobile: A station capable of being operated while in motion

Frequencies:

Contacts can be made on any 2 Meter simplex frequency (Check the attached band plan).

Contest contacts on repeaters are not permitted. However, use of repeaters for solicitation of contacts is allowed.

Exchange:

Stark County stations: Callsign & QTH (i.e.: township, city, village)

Non-Stark County stations: Callsign & QTH (The county you are operating from)

Work stations only once. Work Mobiles/Portables again each time they move to a new township, city, or village

Scoring:

Contacts with Stark County stations count for 2 points

Contacts with stations outside of Stark County count 1 point

Multipliers:

There are 33 possible multipliers. Stark County has 17 Townships, 11 villages, and 5 cities. Each one is a multiplier.

Bonus points:

Contacts with W8LKY count 10 bonus points

Mobile stations get an additional bonus; Add 50 points for each Township, City, or Village activated.

January, 1990, (editors KB8GCE & KB8GCF)
