October Minutes

October 10, 2012

The regular meeting of the Alliance Amateur Radio Club was held on October 10, 2012 at 7:30 PM in the first floor conference room of the Alliance Community Hospital with club President John Myers (KD8MQ) presiding. The pledge of allegiance was recited followed by introductions. There were 19 members present along with Miriam Sanor and guest Bob Scafate (KC8SQS).

President John announced birthdays for the month which included:

He then passed along to the club news from Tomas (KC8ZEH) that Jim (KC8TFG) is back at the Laurels with another attempt to bring him home to be made after a handicapped ramp is completed at his home.

Secretary

Don (AB8KV) gave the Secretary's report, noting that the September meeting minutes were in the newsletter. He reported that he still was in need of equipment information so that a quote from the club's insurance company could be obtained regarding replacement coverage for club-owned items. Frank added that the information would also be needed for ARRL insurance should the club go that route. Finally, Don reminded the club that he still needed Ham of the Year nominations. The Secretary's report was approved motion а by (KD8JRK) and seconded by Butch (WA8SHP).

Treasurer Mary Ann then gave the (KB8IVS) Treasurer's report. The report was approved on a motion by Smitty (KC8TJQ) and seconded by Tony (KD8BBK).

Committee reports:

- No ARES or net reports at this meeting.
- John noted that he still Duane pin for has (W8DHZ) for first-place operator at Field Day. He also stated that the final FD tallies should be available by the next meeting.
- For the repeater committee, John reported that the source of the repeater interference had been traced to an inverter/load center in an RV in the area and had been taken care of. Old business:

 Regarding the proposed upgrade of the club website to a content management system, John and Ben (KD8KMQ) reported on the estimated cost as being \$87.00 per year including maintaining the domain name and hosting. Ben noted that members' QSL cards were needed so that they could be added to the new website, with cards, digital copies or emails to be sent to him.

 John reported that a check had been received for old cell phones that had been turned in from the clubs' recycling program. He encouraged members to continue turning in phones, could be brought to club meetings since there are currently no drop-off points.

New business:

- John reported that he had been talking with Tim Duffy (K3LR) about doing a program for the club. Tim told him that he could possibly do that but not until next spring. However, as an alternative Tim offered to have the club do a field trip and visit to his multi-op contest station in West Middlesex, Pennsylvania. After brief discussion, John asked for a vote as to which was desired. The voice vote was overwhelmingly in favor of the field trip, with driving arrangements to be worked out. John stated that he would contact Tim for a date (hopefully on a Saturday).
- John then asked about borrowing the club's FT-1000 for the Pennsylvania QSO party. The request was approved on a voice vote.

ARES Lesson Of The Week

(editors note: This is an excerpt from a weekly e-mail that arrived from our Ohio ARES SEC, Matt Welch, W8DEC. This is also available on the ARES page on the ARRL Ohio website at www.arrl-ohio.org.)

This week's training topic is What to Do First in Case of an Emergency. You can review the training on Page 6 of the ARES Field Resource Manual. This manual can be downloaded for free by clicking on this LINK.

What to Do First in Case of an Emergency

- 1) Check that you and your family are safe and secure before you respond as an ARES volunteer.
- 2) Check that your property is safe and secure before you respond as an ARES volunteer.
- 3) Monitor your assigned local ARES emergency net frequency.
- 4) Follow the instructions you receive from the ARES officials in charge on the above frequency.
- 5) Contact your local Emergency Coordinator, or his/her designee, for further instructions.

We will respond if we are called.

But, we NEVER self-deploy".

Good words to abide by. Thanks Eric.

International Space Station Spot the Station

Did you know you can see the International Space Station from your house? As the third brightest object in the sky, after the sun and moon, the space station is easy to see if you know where and when to look for it.

NASA's Spot the Station service sends you an email or text message a few hours before the space station passes over your house. The space station looks like a fast-moving plane in the sky, though one with people living and working aboard it more than 200 miles above the ground. It is best viewed on clear nights. For more information on the International Space Station and its mission, visit the space station mission pages.

Spot the Station is available worldwide to anyone with an email account or SMS-enabled phone. Several times a week, Mission Control at NASA's Johnson Space

Center in Houston, TX, determines sighting opportunities for 4,600 locations worldwide. If your specific city or town isn't listed, pick one that is fairly close to you. The space station is visible for a long distance around each of the listed locations.

This service will only notify you of "good" sighting opportunities - that is, sightings that are high enough in the sky (40 degrees or more) and last long enough to give you the best view of the orbiting laboratory. This will be anywhere from once or twice a week to once or twice a month, depending on the space station's orbit. Don't worry if there are big gaps in between sightings! A complete list of all possible space station sightings is available from Johnson Space Center.

November, 1987, (editor N8IAK)

- The upcoming fox hunt was scheduled for Halloween day. A Halloween party was to follow at Don Panchos.
- An anonymous person had stepped up to offer free printing for the Zero Beat.

(There was no November, 1997 issue of the ZB)

November, 1992, (editor N8LVO)

- The 1992 elections had been held in October.
 - The 1992/3 officers were:

 - •VP Larry Ashburn, KE8VE
 - •Treasurer Allen Dicks, WI8T
 - Secretary Dan Mutigli, N8LVO

- John, WX8G related a TV repair where water had entered the rotator cable, and had wicked all the way to the control box, and leaked into the TV.
