AARC Welcomes New. . .er . . . OLD? 2 Meter Repeater

The new repeater went online back in April. A few weeks ago, it was pointed out to me that we were having issues with it not making it all the way through the Thursday night net without cutting out.

After doing some troubleshooting, we contacted Yaesu. After a couple e-mails back & forth, it was decided that a trip to the service center was in order. The repeater has a 3 Yr. warranty, so all we are out is the cost of shipping it to California.

In the meantime, we've hooked up the old repeater that until recently had been in service at K8OMO's OTH.

We are currently running it as an open machine with no tones required. We'll notify you once the Yaesu repeater comes back rom service.

Echolink is still up and running.

W8LKY Special Event Info

The time period for activating the W8LKY special event is coming up soon.

If you'd like to put the club callsign on the air to commemorate our town as the birthplace of the scarlet carnation, there are only a couple rules to follow.

1) You need to contact me and advise the time frame when you will be using the callsign.

2) You will need to submit your logs promptly in ADI format. I will not key in your paper logs for you.

You use the callsign only to the limits of your own license. The only time you can exceed the limits of your license will be with a appropriately licensed control op on site. Spotting yourself online will help people to find you.
