ARRL Field Day June 26/27

Well, it's coming fast; Field Day. We are still looking for a Chairperson for this event, but here's what we know right now.

Who sponsors this? ARRL Field Day is sponsored each June by the ARRL; The National Association for Amateur Radio.



What Is Field Day? It is a combination of Emergency Preparedness, Contest, and Social gathering. For the "official" answer to this question, we recommend that you check out the following flier from the ARRL: "What is ARRL Field Day?".

Where is Field Day? Field Day stations are all around you. They are in parks, and shopping centers. You can find Hams operating Field Day from all kinds of non-standard locations. A map of Field Day groups near you can be found at the ARRL Field Day Site Locator page. You can find this page at arrl.org/field-day-locator.

Our Club (The Alliance ARC) will be setting up at the Sebring Camp Grounds in Sebring. The main entrance can be found at the corner of Johnson Rd, and Texas Ave, in Sebring.

When is it? Field Day is always on the 4th full weekend of June. This year, that falls on the 26th/27th of June. The actual Field Day period is from 1800UTC (2PM) on Saturday, to that same time on Sunday.

There are guidelines for when a group can begin setting up, and where they set up. You should understand these guidelines which are in section 3 of the rules which you can find at http://www.arrl.org/field-day-rules.

Why do we have Field Day? Well, that is a complicated question. If you ask a contester, they will say "Field Day is a contest!". Someone who is into Emergency Communications will call it a "emergency Preparedness exercise. Still others will call it a Social gathering, or homecoming of sorts.

So, whether your Field Day shack is a park, or a campground, or even your home shack, get out there, and get active. You won't regret it.
